Edward C. "Warpy" Osmond, Jr., 72, of Montoursville, died Thursday, July 5, 2018 at the Gatehouse.

Born January 25, 1946 in Baltimore, he was a son of the late Edward C. and Beatrice (Gribben) Osmond, Sr. He married the former Sherry P. Burkhart, and together they would have celebrated 38 years of marriage on July 26th.

Warpy served his country honorably in the Navy during the the Vietnam war. He was a member of the VFW Dubiostown, and the Trout Run Tractor Pull Association. Warpy loved yard sales, big trucks, and Farmall Tractors, especially his restored 1957 Farmall 350.


