“ Rick was very small when his mother asked my parents, Bessie and Densel Trick, to take him and rear him as their own on a 133-acre farm in Penn Township. They readily agreed. Because there were only 18 months' difference in our ages, Rick and I grew up as brothers in the 1950s and early 1960s.

Here are some of my memories, in no particular order:

- Catching firefiles and Japanese beetles
- Being the first in the morning to board the school bus driven by Uncle Fred Crawley
- Swimming in Beaver Lake and the Joe Hole
- Rick's Skoal can in which he kept his treasures
- Patches, the neurotic pony, which ran back to the barn whenever its rider dismounted
- Walking a long distance, fishing poles and worms in hand, to fish in a pond whose owners let us catch "sunnies"
- Midnight pillow fights in our shared bedroom, until Dad burst through the door and settled our hash with a cuff to the head
- Building forts and waging battles in the haymows of the barn
- Building oats shocks and hoisting heavy bales of hay onto a wagon
- The stick ponies with stuffed heads and the shirts Dad's mother, Bertha, made for us from printed feed sacks
- Racing across loose boards high in the rafters of the barn regardless of the danger
- "Acting up" in church, to Mom's embarrassment and despair
- Slamming a storm door, only to have Rick run his hand through the glass, cutting himself badly
- Throwing rotten chicken eggs onto the barn roof to create as great a stench as we could
- Visits with Evelyn and Ray at their home, at Evelyn's parents' home in Hughesville, or at Ray's parents' rural home
- Each of us getting our own transistor radio that Dad had won on a punchboard at work
- Threshing, butchering, filling burlap bags with grain to be taken to the gristmill and converted into "chop"
- Rick getting out of washing dishes because he played with plastic soldiers in the suds instead of doing the dishes

Rick and I spent some 15 years or so on the farm. Eventually, we went our separate ways. It was right and good that we should do so. Yet memory easily takes me back to a time when it seemed always summer and endless adventures beckoned.

May I express my sincere sympathy to Sarah and to her immediate and extended families. Revel in your own memories.
